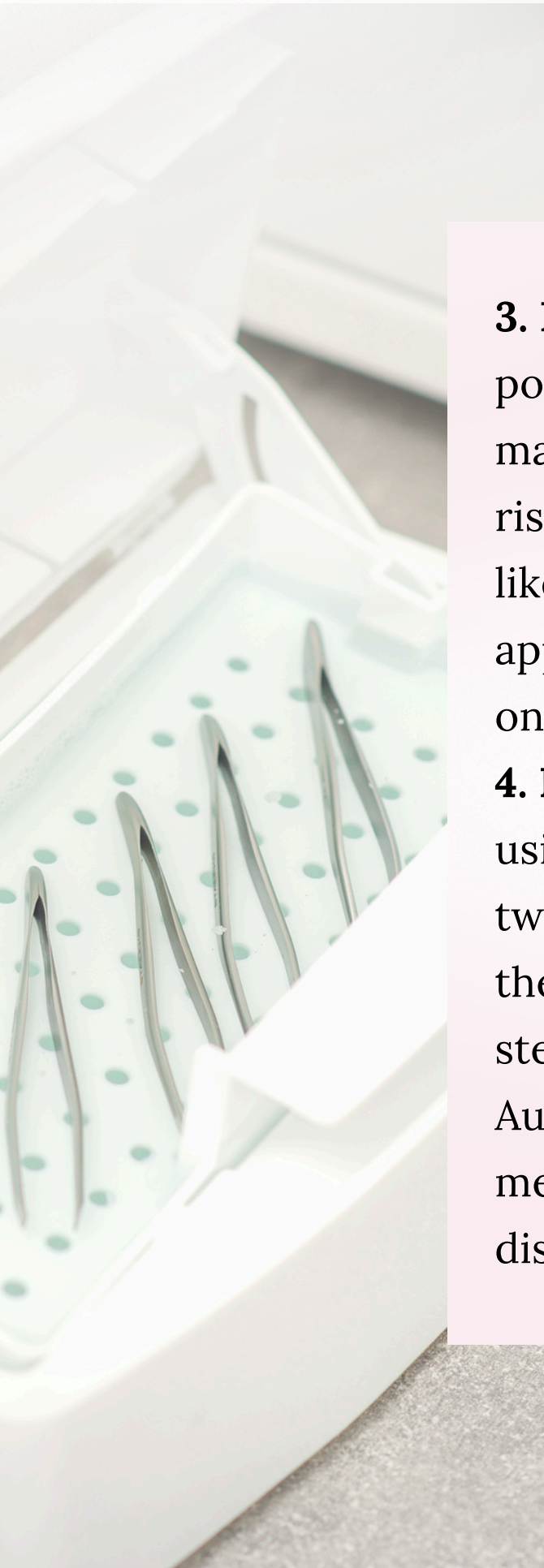
**A step-by-step Sanitation**

By following these steps and adhering to strict hygiene and disinfection practices, lash artists can ensure a safe and clean environment for their clients and minimize the risk of infections or adverse reactions during lash extension procedures.



Disinfection in the context of Lash Extensions is Crucial to Maintain a Clean and Safe Environment for both the Lash Artist and the Client. Here are important steps and rules for Disinfection in lash Extensions:

- 1. Hand Hygiene :** Begin by thoroughly washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds before starting any lash extension procedure. always sanitize your hands if you touch anything while your doing lashes.
- 2. Sanitizing Workstations :** Clean and disinfect all surfaces and tools that will come into contact with the client. This includes the lash bed, lash trays, adhesive holders, and any other equipment. Use a hospital-grade disinfectant specifically designed for surfaces.



**3. Disposable Tools :** Whenever possible, use disposable tools and materials to minimize the risk of cross-contamination. Items like disposable brushes and applicators can be used only once and then discarded.

**4. Non-Disposable Tools :** If you're using non-disposable tools, such as tweezers, make sure they are thoroughly cleaned and sterilized between clients. Autoclaving is the most effective method for sterilizing non-disposable tools.





**5. Clean Linens and Drapes :** Use clean linens and drapes for each client, and change them between appointments.

**6. Hand Protection:** Wear disposable gloves during the disinfection process to prevent direct skin contact and to maintain Aseptic conditions.





**7. Client Preparation :** Advise clients to arrive with clean lashes and no eye makeup. Provide them with protective eyewear to prevent any contact between adhesive and their eyes.

**8. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) :** Use PPE like face masks and face shields when working closely with clients, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic.







**9. Proper Ventilation :** Ensure good ventilation in your workspace to reduce the buildup of fumes from adhesives and disinfectants

**10. Regular Cleaning :** Implement a routine cleaning schedule for your workspace, including disinfecting all surfaces, door handles, and common areas.

**11. Record Keeping :** Maintain records of your cleaning and disinfection procedures, as well as client information and consent form.
